Report on 4th Winter University Games held at CNR

INTRODUCTION

The 4th University Games was held at College of Natural Resources from 12th -17th December, 2017. The conduct of the Games was well planned and prepared in advance. The BUSF Secretariat conducted preliminary coordination meeting with members of the host organizing committee of 4th University Games on 21st November, 2017 presided by Dr. Kezang Sherab, the General Secretary of the BUSF.

There were eight participating colleges; College of Natural Resources, College of Language and Culture Studies, Sherab College, Jigme Namgyel Engineering College, Samtse College of Education, College of Science and Technology, Gaeddu College of Business Studies, and Paro College of Education. The winter University Game comprises of three disciplines; football, volleyball, and basketball. There were 280 participants during the games. The 4th winter University game was successfully face lifted by tireless and dedicated 33 volunteers from College of Natural Resources.

THE GOALS OF THE WINTER UNIVERSITY GAMES

4. To link like-minded external organization to colleges and to FISU
5. To educate through and within University sports
6. To learn about colleges' sports development activities and projects
7. To learn University sports management organization and skills

OPENING CEREMONY

The *Opening Ceremony Programme* was held on 12th December, 2017 presided by Dasho Nidup Dorji, Vice Chancellor, RUB the President of BUSF as the *Guest of Honour*. The opening ceremony began with the playing of BUSF anthem and hoisting of BUSF Flag and the flags of the participating colleges. The Chief Commissioner of Games, the Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. Ugyen Dorji, gave welcome note to the participants, technical officials and the volunteers participating in 4th University Games.

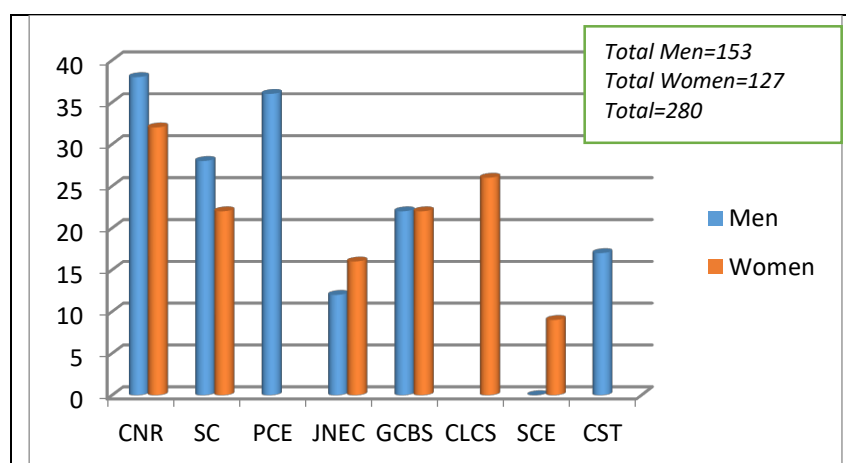

The table above represents details of match for each discipline: football, volleyball, and basketball respectively. There were seven matches for each discipline including final match. There were four teams from each of four regions for both men and women category. For example, there were four men football teams, one from each region. Similarly, there were two football teams from each region; one men football team and a women football team respectively. This applies to all the disciplines-football, volley ball, and basketball. In total, there were eight football teams-four men and four women football teams respectively. Similarly, eight teams each for other two disciplines-volleyball and basketball. So, at the end of tournament, there were seven matches for a gender for each discipline that totals up to 42 matches.

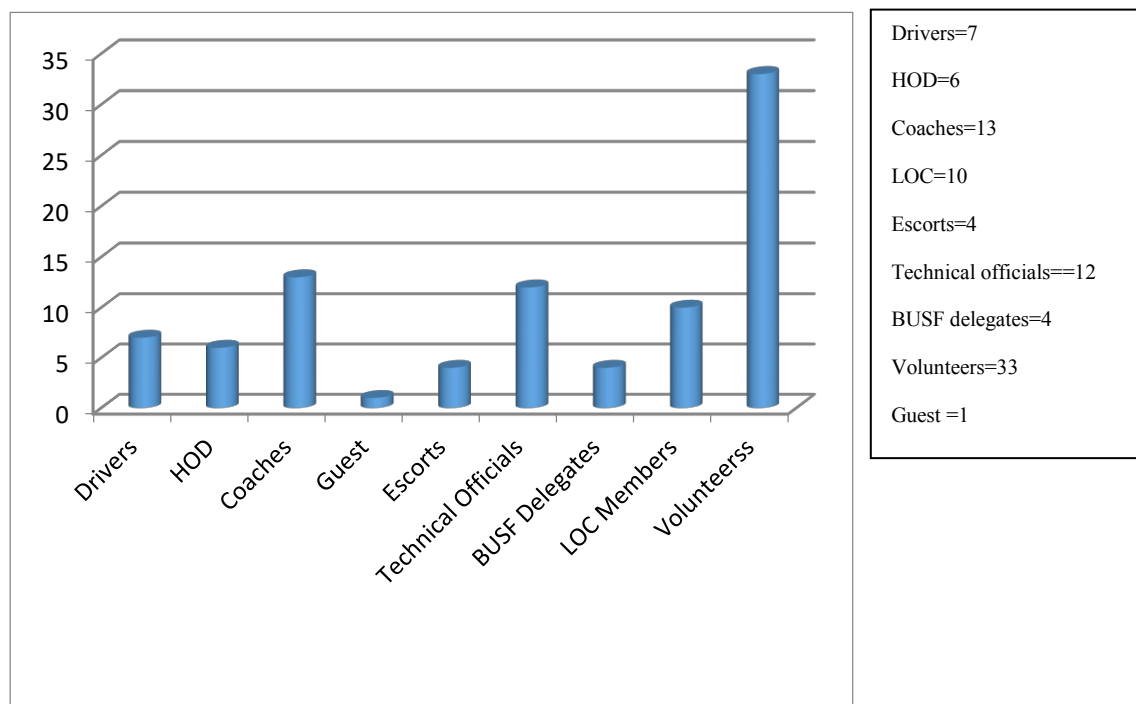
PARTICIPANTS IN THE 4TH UNIVERSITY GAME

The University game consisted of three disciplines; football, volleyball, and basketball respectively. Both gender-men and women participated in all the three disciplines. From eight

participating colleges for 4th University games, there were one hundred and fifty three (153) men and one hundred and twenty seven (127) women participants during the games. So, in total, there were two hundred and eighty (280) participants from eight different colleges.

DETAILS OF OFFICIALS AND OTHER DELEGATES INVOLVED



The Local Organizing Committee (LOC) Members were selected from the host college i.e College of Natural Resources. The LOC comprises of the President (Advisor of the game), the Dean of Student Affairs (DSA, the Chief Commissioner) and three Commissioners for each of three disciplines; Commissioner for Football, Commissioner for Basketball, and Commissioner for Volleyball respectively. The other six members of LOC headed other delegated jobs during the game.

The General Secretary, the Deputy General Secretary, the Technical Head, and the BUSF Coordinator were assisted by thirty-three tireless volunteers from College of Natural Resources during the preparation of University game.

There were four escorts escorting participants from different colleges, seven drivers, and six HODs (Head of Delegation)

Each discipline was coached by a coach totaling 13 coaches for different disciplines. Twelve (12) Technical Officials of which four (4) technical officials each for each discipline officiated during 4th University game, 2017.

CLOSING CEREMONY

The closing ceremony of 4th University Games was held on 17th December, 2017. The closing ceremony consisted of two matches in football. The final for women football and men football were played. The finals were played between CLCS vs. GCBS and PCE vs. CST respectively followed by the awards. After award ceremony, the flame of the BUSF games and the flags were lowered. The President, CNR, the advisor of games handed over the BUSF flag to the Dean of Student Affairs, GCBS, which was decided to be the host for 5th University Games.
